These deficiencies have resulted in an over-reliance on faxes, phone calls, and other manual reporting means, often resulting in missing data. Manual methods and incomplete data create additional burden on providers and has slowed the ability of public health officials to identify hotspots, perform crucial outreach, and inform reopening decisions. This presentation will review challenges related to four use cases within public health data exchange—vaccine data, lab reporting, case reporting, and syndromic surveillance—and potential policy recommendations to improve the collection and exchange of data.</i></p>
